Some Simple but Scary FACTS about Tobacco Use Among Youth



- The younger people begin smoking cigarettes, the more likely they are to become strongly addicted to nicotine.
- More than 3 million kids under the age of 18 are current tobacco users.
- More than 6.3 million children under age 18 alive today will eventually die from smokingrelated disease, unless current rates are reversed.
